PLANNING & ZONING COMMISSION

There is one vacancy on the Planning & Zoning Commission (P&Z). P&Z is a fivemember board appointed by Kindred City Council that applies the city's planning and zoning regulations (Chapter 4) within the city's limits and extraterritorial (ET) limits. Members must be residents of the City of Kindred. P&Z meets monthly and each member receives compensation.

KINDRED PARK BOARD

Kindred Park Board has a vacant seat. Interested persons must be a qualified voter and reside within Kindred city limits. Park Board members meet once per month and receive compensation. To apply, send a resume and cover letter to: Kindred Park District, PO Box 243, Kindred ND. SPECIAL ASSESSMENT COMMISSION

There is one vacancy on the Special Assessment Commission (SAC). The SAC consists of three members who are appointed by Kindred City Council in order to oversee the special assessment process as set out in North Dakota Century Code Section 40-23-01. Members must be residents of the City of Kindred. The Commission's obligation is to assess, as fair and equally as possible, the costs of various improvement projects within a defined assessment area determined by the City Council. In other words, the commission apportions the cost of the projects by determining the amount of



benefit to each property in a given improvement district.

The commission meets on an as-needed basis when active projects are nearing or have reached final completion. Typically, each project will require 2-4 SAC meetings, for which each member will receive compensation.

Recycling Tote "Tagging" To Begin in August

Waste Management will begin "tagging" recycling totes in August similar to the images below. What does it mean if your tote receives a tag? Well, it means there were some problematic materials in your recycling tote. Recycling totes will have a label or tag affixed noting the issue to be corrected. It may not be picked up in the future, or WM may remove the tote altogether if issues continue to persist. Review, but please do not remove tags.

How to avoid the tag:

Know what's recyclable - study the flyer below for a list of items that belong in the recycling tote and what does NOT belong in the recycling tote. Clean out food, drain out liquids - even one item can contaminate the whole entire tote or truckload of recyclable materials. Don't bag recyclables - toss items loosely into the recycle tote without a bag. Don't hesitate to reach out to Waste Management with any questions.


