An initial funding commitment from the North Dakota Department of Health allows the City of Kindred to utilize the app at no cost for two years.

The information available is collaborative effort with contributors such as Kindred Park District, Kindred Library, Kindred Public School, local businesses, and YOU!

Check out the "Alerts & Updates" for community events and important city alerts. "Upcoming Events" lists (yep, you guessed it) upcoming events such as Bone Builders, City Council meetings, and Library events like Story Time, Book Club, and more!

The app also provides a one-stop shop with links to area organizations such as the Kindred Area Arts Partnership, Kindred Area Food Pantry, Kindred Wildlife Club, Kindred Area Dollars for Scholars, local churches, and more. The app has more than just calendar reminders and links. Any app user can submit a variety of items - coupons or deals for your business, events, items for sale, fundraisers, job postings, rummage sale listings, and more!

To qualify for appointment, members must be residents of the City of Kindred. Its obligation is to assess, as fair and equally as possible, the costs of various improvement

projects within a defined assessment area determined by the City Council. In other words, the commission apportions the cost of projects by determining the amount of benefit to each property in a given improvement district.

The commission meets on an as-needed basis when active projects are nearing or have reached final completion. Typically, each project will require 2-4 SAC meetings, for which each member will receive compensation.

KACF Grant Application Deadline November 1

KINDRED, ND – The Kindred Area Community Foundation is accepting applications for its 2023 grant round. Applications are available online at www.ndcf.net/kindred and are <u>due back by</u> November 1, 2023.

Any organization holding a current 501 (c)3 tax status from the IRS would qualify for a grant, as well as schools, park districts and organizations with a formal city

government relationship. The Advisory Committee will be distributing over \$6,000 to worthy community projects for the year.

The Kindred Area Community Foundation has a permanent endowment fund, meaning that all gifts to the Foundation are placed into a permanent fund where only a portion of the earnings are used on an annual basis to make grants. A local Advisory Committee will review all grant applications and make recommendations on funding amounts.

Inevitable Return of Winter

Snow will soon be falling on our streets and sidewalks (whether you're ready or not). Please help keep our streets, sidewalks, and alleyways clear for everyone's safety. Follow these helpful guidelines: SIDEWALKS:

- * Please clear your sidewalks in a timely fashion after a snowfall.
- Remove all snow & ice from the entire width/length of the sidewalk.
- * Do NOT shovel/blow/move any snow onto city streets or other people's property without permission.
- * If you are on a corner lot, be sure to clear sidewalks, curbs, and ramps all the way to the street.
- * If you have a fire hydrant on your property, clear that as well to ensure easy access in the event of an emergency.
- Renters check your lease! Snow removal may be your responsibility as a renter. Landlords - remember to clearly discuss who is responsible for snow removal and make sure your renters are aware of the city's snow removal rules.
- * If you are leaving for an extended time, find a neighbor or snow removal company to shovel your sidewalks and driveway.

STREETS/ALLEYWAYS:

- * Do NOT shovel/blow/move any snow ONTO city streets or alleys.
- * Keep alleyways clear of vehicles, debris, and any obstacles that may impede the City's snow removal efforts.
- * Remove garbage and recycling totes as promptly as possible.

- * Move your vehicle off of city streets and alleyways. This allows trucks to widen the streets for safe travel.
- * Do NOT clear snow or ice from city streets yourself. You are liable for any damages.


